


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

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### Instructions

- Print and laminate the resources for added durability. Cut out the pineapples and then use a one hole punch to make a hole at the bottom of each pineapple.
- Choose a pineapple and add the two numbers on the sunglasses together. Write the answer in the mouth using an erasable marker. Optional Record the fact families for each pineapple on the recording sheet.
- Use counting links (in two colors) at the bottom of each pineapple to model the part part whole concept.
